This research will advance the mentoring literature by illuminating the interpersonal context of STEM research apprenticeships. We sought funding to dive deeply into the interpersonal context of STEM research apprenticeships. We leverage a mixed-methods approach wherein best practices in quantitative methods (e.g., dyadic longitudinal designs) are used in a complementary fashion with qualitative methods to provide information about STEM research apprenticeships that is both comprehensive and nuanced.
- The Neon Pacific Initiative: Placemaking, Community Engagement, and Asian American Studies at UNLV. (Role: Co-I). Do responsible gambling practices explain associations among gambling motives, disordered gambling, and PTSD? Comparing Nevadan college students to U.S. adults. (Role: Co-PI). International Gaming Institute (IGI). \$3,000 (direct costs), \$0 (indirect costs), \$3,000 (total costs). Funded research for 2022-2023 will investigate the mediating role of different responsible gambling behaviors and beliefs in the associations between PTSD symptoms, gambling motives, and gambling disorder severity and symptomology. The secondary aim is to establish current prevalence rates of responsible gambling practices that are nationally representative of the U.S. population, according to age, education, gender, race/ethnicity, and geographical region, since this information is presently unavailable in research databases.

- Associations Between Problem Gambling and Other Problematic Behavioral Patterns in Nevadan College Students. (Role: Co-PI). International Gaming Institute (IGI). \$3,000 (direct costs), \$0 (indirect costs), \$3,000 (total costs). Funded research for 2021-2022 examined how various problematic behaviors involving a specific substance or activity are currently associated with problem gambling in college students from Nevada. This study investigated several psychosocial factors that may contribute to problem gambling and its association with other problematic behaviors in this population.
- The Links Between Problem Gambling & Video Gaming In Emerging Adulthood: An Examination of Student & Non-Student Populations. (Role: Co-PI). This study investigated the relationship between video gaming and gambling disorders for emerging adults.
